Organization

Job Description

The Global Citizenship Program invites applications for the position of Adjunct Faculty Member in Sociology during the university's Fall Semester 2018 academic period (August 27 – December 21). Candidates interested in teaching the following course are invited to apply:

Course Title: Sociology 1100: Introduction to Sociology

The above course is designed for students majoring in areas outside sociology. The course provides a broad overview of the field, its methods of inquiry, concepts and analyses of society. Further specification of course content to be determined in consideration of the adjunct faculty member's particular research strengths, and in cooperation with the department head.

The Adjunct Faculty Member in Sociology will join a Global Citizenship Program faculty composed of researchers in philosophy, cultural anthropology, sociology, history, literature, women and gender studies, science and the arts. To advance the university's mission of preparing student-scholars for an increasingly globalized world, Webster Vienna students pursue a liberal arts-based training in the human sciences alongside their respective major and/or minor field of study in the departments of Business & Management, International Relations, Media Communications, and Psychology. The Global Citizenship Program seeks to advance the liberal arts by supporting its students and faculty in developing new approaches to the most pressing areas of contemporary research in the human sciences.

Qualifications

The interested applicant is expected to:

- be either an advanced doctoral student or hold a PhD (or equivalent) in a related field, and have a professional track record in the field.
- have demonstrated achievements in academic research.
- be a dedicated and innovative teacher interested in joining a student-centered learning environment.
- possess full professional fluency in English.
- have the legal right to work in Austria.

Conditions of employment
